Crusheen/Tubber go to well

Both teams deserve a lot of credit for delivering a very entertaining, fully committed game, which maintained the interest of everyone present from the throw-in to the last puck.

Crusheen/Tubber were very strong down the middle with Ross Hayes, John Fawle, Ronan Monahan and Cillien Mullins prominent, while corner-forward Breffni Horner was the game's best performer.

Broadford power past Clonlara in east Clare derby

BROADFORD powered their way into the county final meeting with Crusheen/Tubber when having seven points to spare over Clonlara in this penultimate round clash that was played out on Sunday morning.

The young men from Glenomara Park laid the foundations for this win with an impressive first half display when a two-goal blast from James Vaughan, which was added to by another from a Niall O'Brien penalty helped them build up a comprehensive 3-6 to 1-2 interval lead.

With Niall O'Brien and Diarmuid O'Brien also chipping in with 0-3 each the energetic Broadford side were full value for the ten-point advantage, which had come after they were rocked by an early goal from Paraic O'Lough-

Kieran Galvin also chipped in with a couple of points for the Darach Honan trained Clon-lara side in that first half, but it wasn't until the third quarter that they really got going, with O'Loughlin and Galvin leading their back into contention in bringing it back a six-point game when hitting the first four points of the second

Crucially, however, Niall O'Brien and Darren Chaplin then managed to get the scoreboard ticking once more for Bradford - they needed to because with the game narrowing down to a 3-7 to 1-8 differential Clonlara had a chance to bring it back to a point when they were awarded a penalty.

Galvin went for the goal but his shot flashed over the bar to leave four between them, a re-prieve that Broadford then grabbed in the closing minutes as they hit 0-4 in the closing stages to keep up their hopes of a first Under 21 B title since 2005 when they beat Corofin in the final.
