# Ballyvaughan reach the semi's

BALLYVAUGHAN almost threw this one away. Leading by 1-6 to 0-5 at half time, they disappeared for the second period and only for the in-eptitude of the Naomh Eoin forward line in front of the posts, they could have been in real trouble. In the end it was corner-forward John Martin who earned them a semi-final spot with six points in a comprehensive performance which saved Ballyvaughan's blushes.

Naomh Eoin had nothing to lose after going down to Cratloe in round one but despite displaying plenty of pride, their forwards couldn't convert at vital times, hitting twelve wides in total even though they were aided considerably by referee Vincent Kil-leen who for some unknown reason, played forty minutes in a suspenceful, charged second-half.

Ballyvaughan led the way and opened the scoring four minutes in from a John Martin free which was cancelled out two minutes later by an impressive Seamus Boland effort. Naomh Eoin then took the lead when Lorcan Lynch pointed but their advantage was short lived as Ballyvaughan thundered back with a goal through James Hynes in the eighth minute. The midfielder came close minutes earlier when his incisive run almost ended with a score but this time his run proved more fruitful and after receiving a slick handpass from Jack Queally, Hynes blasted the ball to the top right hand corner to leave the score 1-1 to 0-2.

This score should have lifted Ballyvaughan but instead they sat back and let Naomh Eoin advance at them. For the next fifteen minutes, it was all Naomh Eoin as they attacked in waves and the ball rarely crossed the halfway line. Points from Michael Liddane and Pat Foley followed but it was scant reward for their dominance as they also hit six wides in this period.

Eventually, Naomh Eoin tired and in a whirlwind phase, Ballvaughan hit a purple patch of four points in as many minutes, three from the boot of Martin and one from Jack Queally. Liddane then hit back and scored a fine opportunist point but it was Ballyvaughan who went into the interval the happier after an inspirational score from Kieran Casey who made a fantastic overlapping run from corner back to leave the half time score 1-6 to 0-5.

Ballyvaughan rang the changes at the interval in a bid to reinvigorate the forward line, bringing in Jason McDonagh and Kevin Carrucan but it seemed to backfire as Naomh Eoin took the initiative once again. Bolland pointed from a free in the 36th minute but this was to be the last score for fifteen minutes as both teams failed miserably to convert chances. As the game wore on, Naomh Eoin looked more and more likely to score but Michael Liddane. Seamus Bolland and Pat Foley were repeatedly frustrated in front of the

Frustration from both sides almost spilled over from time to time but eventually in the 51st minute, a Pat Foley free put just two between the sides. However they couldn't capitalise on that score and as time ran out, it was Ballyvaughan and John Martin in particular who extended their lead with two innovative scores in the 58th and 59th to leave the score 1-8 to 0-7.

It seemed all over but neither side was prepared for the extra ten minutes which the referee added on and another Boland free made the injury time period extremely tense. But it wasn't to be as Naomh Eoin constantly hit brick walls and the win was assured in the 69th minute by substitute Jason McDonagh to send the Ballyvaughan following home satisfied.

A 100 per cent record sees Ballvaughan into the latter stages with a game to spare but they will need to concentrate for the full sixty minutes if they hold any aspirations of achieving glory this year.
